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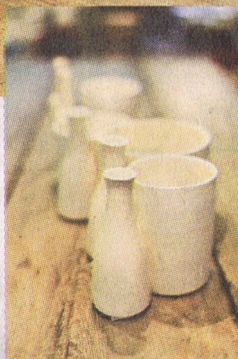

Canvas Finds Room to Breathe

▶ A year ago, the first Canvas store opened in SoHo. Last week, a second one quietly opened in Chelsea, in a space that for years housed the Door Store. “The space in SoHo doesn’t have enough room to show our complete furniture collection or the vintage pieces we sell,” said Andrew Corrie, the owner. “Here we can properly display everything.”

At about 4,000 square feet, the new store is double



the size of the first, and gives the company’s furniture, lighting, tableware and decorative accessories — all of which have a sustainable or ethical angle — room to breathe. Prices range from \$12 for a gold coffee spoon to \$3,500 for the Mercer loveseat.
